MADISON — Bert E. Miller, age 101, of 334 West Doty Street, died on Friday, June 22, 1984, at Methodist Health Center. He was born on October 20, 1882, in New Diggings, Wisconsin, the son of John Ralph Miller and Annie C. Miller. He was a graduate of Platteville Normal and a 1911 graduate of the University of Wisconsin School of Electrical Engineering. Mr. Miller had worked with the University of Wisconsin, the General Electric Company, and the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin. In 1924 he joined Wisconsin Power and Light and retired as its secretary in 1947. From 1947 to 1948 he was the manager of the Village of Shorewood Hills. Mr. Miller organized the Wisconsin Blue Shield-Blue Cross Plan, served on its Board of Directors for 25 years, and as its president from 1958 until 1965. He was a clerk of the Nakoma School Board, and was instrumental in the building of the Nakoma Public School. He was a member of the Board of the Madison Water Utility and a Trustee of the Wisconsin Hospital Association. Mr. Miller was a charter member of the Madison Optimist Club, serving as District Governor and as International Vice President of Optimists International. He was a member of the board of the Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, a charter member of the University Methodist Church, having served as Sunday School Superintendent and President of its board. Mr. Miller was President of the Wesley Foundation for the University and statewide. He was president of the Madison Council of Churches. In 1931 he was elected to the board of Directors of Methodist Hospital and served as its President for 17 years. He was appointed as administrator of the hospital, serving from 1948 until 1959. In 1959 he was elected Emeritus Director of Methodist Hospital. In December of 1970 Mr. Miller was elected to the United Methodist Hall of Fame for his philanthropic work. He was preceded in death by his wife, Helen Shepard Miller on October 1, 1969. He is survived by a nephew, John R. (Jack) Miller of Madison; four nieces, Jeannie Grim of Roseville, California, Ann Zerbel of Madison, Virginia Nelson of Osh Kosh, Wisconsin, and Janet Jefferies of Atlanta, Georgia; a foster daughter, Mrs. LeRoy Klose of San Diego, California; many other cousins, relatives, and friends.
