Bradford Smith: ■ William Outspoken Madison attorney and former alderman William Bradford Smith, 76, died Friday at his home of pancreatic can-

Smith was first elected to the City Council in 1961 and represented the old 19th ward for six vears. He later served as council president. His wife, Betty, represented the same ward in the mid-1970s.

While on the Council in 1963, Smith helped pass the Madison Equal Housing Opportunity ordinance that became a template for state and federal housing policies.

Smith ran unsuccessfully as the Republican candidate for Congress against Democratic U.S. Rep. Robert Kastenmeier in 1966. During that campaign, he flew to Vietnam on his own fact-finding mission.

He was as devoted to social causes as political ones and was founding director of the Madison Urban League and a long-time member of First Congregational United Church of Christ.

He was an army pilot during World War II, training student navigators and flying B-29 combat duty. He received his bachelor's and law degrees from the University of Wisconsin in the 1940s, working in the circulation department of The Wisconsin State Journal to finance his schooling.

He later taught in the UW

Extension law department.

Visitation for Smith will be 1 to 2 p.m. Wednesday at First Congregational United Church of Christ, 1609 University Ave. A memorial service will follow.
